



Livery Food Initiative Requests for 2025

London continues to face a severe food poverty crisis.

London has the highest poverty rate in the UK. In inner London, 30% of households are in distress, and for some groups, the rate is even higher, reaching 53% for single parents. Shockingly, 2 million people in the city are facing food poverty, and food banks and charities are feeling immense pressure with the growing demand for food and other services.

Why City Harvest?

City Harvest is a food charity that addresses food waste and poverty in London. Every week, they rescue over 120 tons of surplus food from the food industry and deliver it to 375+ charities. City Harvest first worked with Livery Companies during the pandemic, through the Livery Kitchen Initiative.

How the Livery Food Initiative support is evolving

Our support to <u>City Harvest</u> has evolved in response to their challenges. **In Year One**, we raised funds for a Van to transport food across London. **In Year Two**, we raised most of the funds for a much larger food collection Truck. Together, the two vehicles have transported **1.6 million meals so far**.

In **Year Three**, the final year of our fundraising, we want to help City Harvest establish a new **Distribution Centre** at New Covent Garden Market (NCGM), Nine Elms. NCGM is the UK's largest market for fruit and vegetables, with 152 wholesalers based in the market, and it serves 40% of the fruit and vegetables eaten outside of the home in London. Following a successful pilot earlier in the year, City Harvest has secured a 2,164-square-foot site in the market, including a chiller with 24 pallet spaces and a dry area, to serve as its third distribution centre. The site will rescue nutritious food from the market traders, which will then be delivered directly to the charity's community partners. This location will give City Harvest access to surplus healthy food that was unavailable before. It is ideally placed for the charity to increase its support in South London and distribute the food to areas such as Wandsworth and Lewisham where the need is significant. Over its first year, the site will deliver 900,000 meals to people in need.

In response to the above, we have three requests for Livery Charities in our final year.

- 1. To help us raise **the final £64,000** needed to keep the Livery-funded Truck on the road for three years.
- 2. To contribute at least £120,000 to cover the costs of City Harvest staffing and rent at their newly established site at New Covent Garden Market in 2025 (see overleaf for costings).
- 3. Over the last two years, Livery Companies have helped City Harvest enormously through providing contacts, building relationships, giving professional expertise, offering the use of Livery Halls and by their members volunteering at City Harvest Depots. **Please get in touch** with <u>City Harvest</u> if you feel your Company or Charity might be able to help.

3. Background information

City Harvest was founded in 2014. Its company registration number is 08986929 and its charity registration number 1163055. Its registered office is Unit 8, Acton Park Estate, The Vale, London W3 7QE and its website www.cityharvest.org.uk. Copies of its accounts up to 31st March 2024 are available on the Charity Commission website. The LCCG members of the Food Task Group carried out appropriate due diligence on City Harvest. City Harvest provides regular impact summaries to LCCG, who share them with contributors.
